Life cycle - the stages a living thing goes through in its life

Metamorphosis - the process some animals go through to become adults

Habitat - the particular place an animal lives

Camouflage - a way of hiding by looking like the surroundings

Senses - The five major senses are vision, hearing, smell, taste and touch. Each sense has its own sense organ that receive the messages about that sense when stimulated.

Carnivores - animals that eat only meat

Herbivores - animals that eat only plants

Omnivores - animals that eat both meat and plants.

FISH



- breathe underwater, using gills, not lungs.
- live in water
- have scales and fins. (no hair or fur)
- Cold-blooded.
- lay MANY eggs.



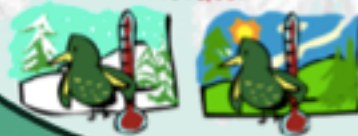
AMPHIBIANS

- live on land & in water.
- Cold-blooded.
- lay eggs.
- moist skin.
- webbed feet.



BIRDS

- have feathers & wings →
- lay eggs
- have 2 legs
- ear holes instead of ears.
- warm-blooded



INVERTEBRATES

Do not have backbones but hard external skeletons
Includes insects who have two antennae



- Six legs
- 3 body parts

MAMMALS

- give birth to live young? →
- have hair or fur →
- mammal mothers nurse their young with milk.
- warm-blooded



REPTILES

- have scales, not fur.
- they have dry skin.
- usually lay eggs, sometimes live young
- cold-blooded.
