

Hally Pother Nh Ukraine The ongoing situation in Ukraine is deeply distressing for us all. We wanted to share some resources to support conversations you may be having with your children. Even if your child is not watching the news, they may still hear about these events in other ways, and this may cause anxiety for them. We deliberately have not talked about the war in Ukraine as a whole school, so far, but instead we have listened to your children and teachers have answered questions, using their professional judgement on a class by class basis. This week in assembly, we told the children that if they have anything they want to talk about, they should tell their grownups what they already know, and what they think about it.
