It's tomorrow! Please drop Egg-mobiles into the hall from 8.45 - parents welcome to come in to see the entries and of course to stay for the races.

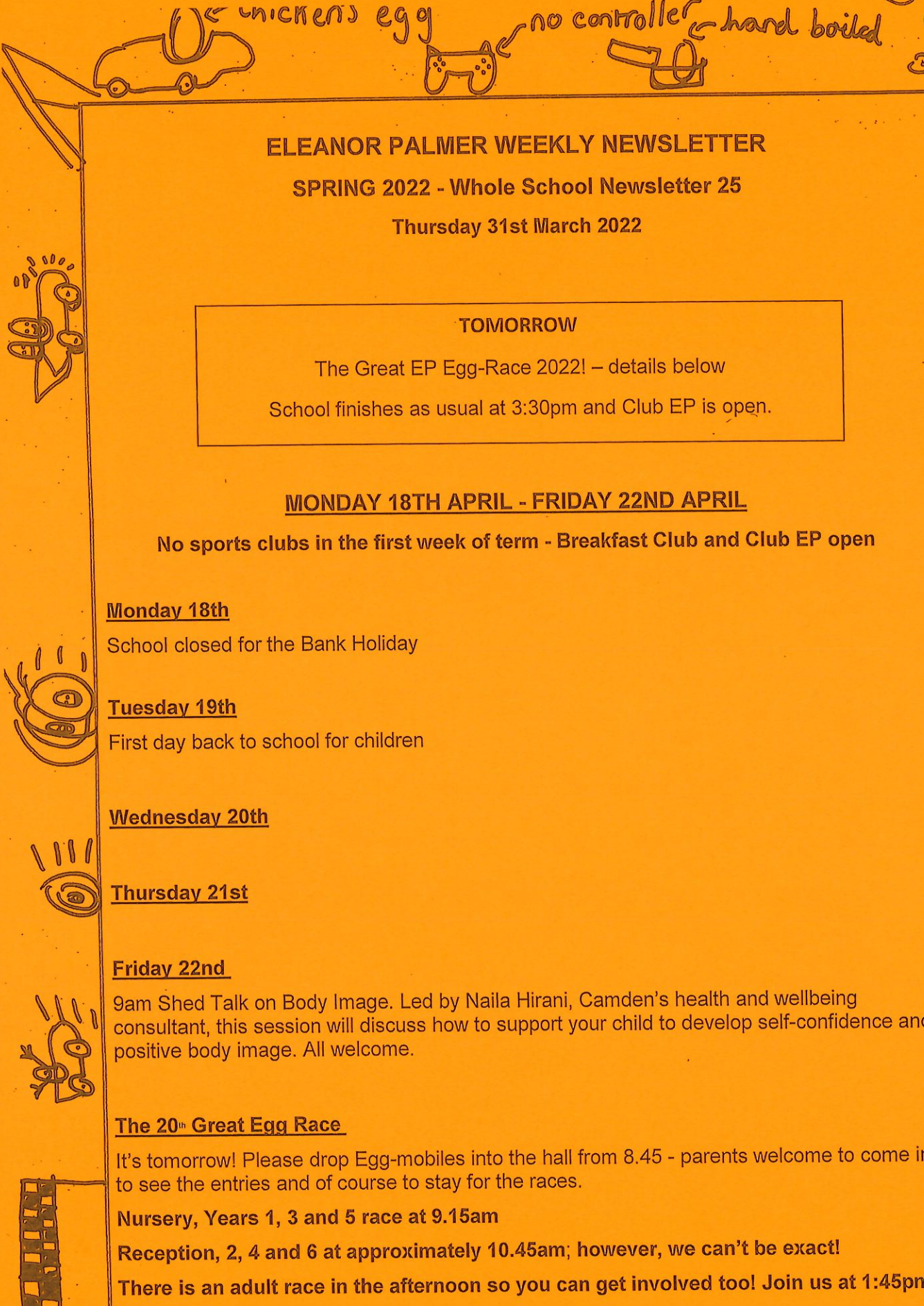
Nursery, Years 1, 3 and 5 race at 9.15am
