To discover what our local area was like in Victorian times, comparing similarities and differences to modern Camden.


To study sources to build a picture of key events such as the Industrial Revolution and figures such as Charles Dickens.

Empire	Monarchy					
The name for a group of countries ruled by a single person, government or country. The word comes from a Latin word, imperium, meaning government or rule. The British Empire expanded during the Victorian era and was the largest the world had ever seen by 1901.	A monarchy is a form of government that has a single person known as a monarch at its head. Monarchs use such titles as king, queen, emperor, or empress. Queen Victoria was queen for 63 years and inherited the role from her uncle, as he had no children.					










