## Communication

**Teaching is not a desk job: our teachers' and LSAs' time is treasure!** Our teachers and LSAs are focused on the children in their class from 8:45 - 3:30pm, after and before which they are planning and preparing for learning. We want our staff team to be interesting and interested people with healthy and fulfilling lives so they can be the best teachers they can be. We ask that you respect this dedication by knowing that **emails to staff won't be read before 7am and after 6pm**, and that although they will do their utmost to respond quickly, as you can appreciate, teaching brilliant lessons comes first.

If there is an urgent message, please call the school office and this will be passed on immediately.

We encourage you to **make appointment for a phone call or meeting with your child's teacher** if you have any questions or concerns about your child's experience at school, which would require a more private conversation. Do this by emailing the teacher directly or telling the office, saying why you would like to meet.

In the mornings, allow teachers to settle their class in their classroom by **dropping children in Years 3-6 at the junior block door**, and in the infants, **encouraging children to enter the classroom independently**, enabling the teaching team to focus on all the children.

In Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, **use the whiteboards at the classroom door** to note arrangements for picking up your child if they're different from usual. If your child has an appointment during the school day, please let the office know and **come directly to the office to collect your child** rather than to the classroom.

There are many ways in which our school communicates with parents and carers, not least face to face after school or over the phone. You can expect to receive: a monthly whole school newsletter replacing the weekly orange newsletter, a weekly class newsletter (from week 3), a class curriculum letter at the beginning of each term. Text message reminders and emails are also used to share important information. Please ensure that your contact details are up to date with our office, as we also need correct details in case of emergencies. It is now expected that we have a minimum of 4 contact numbers.

#### Attendance

At EP, every second is precious and our teachers make sure every learning opportunity is used! Please make every effort to **ensure your child is in their classroom by 9am, if not at 8:45am for quiet early work**. This is so important for your child to hear the teacher's plans for the day ahead, ensuring a settled start and readiness to learn.

#### **Black History Month - October**

Next month marks Black History and, as in previous years, we will teach the whole school more about Black British History in particular, sharing stories of prominent figures in the Black community. If you would like to support EP by reading a story, speaking to one or more classes, or sharing something related to Black history, please get in touch.

## Key Information and dates for your diary

## Meet the teacher - Thursday 14th September - 5-5:30pm & 5:30-6pm

Ahead of our parent progress meetings with individual parents on the 3rd and 5th Oct, each teacher will do a short introductory talk for parents explaining the year's curriculum, class routines and expectations and ways in which parents can support. There will of course be time for questions too and these sessions are very interactive. Because many of you have two or more children, each teacher will talk at 5pm and then again at 5:30pm. We will ring a bell at changeover time! This is a good opportunity to meet with other parents in your class too! Please note: these are adult only meetings.

#### New term reminders:

- Term dates are on the website and EP App. With such good notice of dates, there shouldn't be any accidental holiday bookings... we want to continue our amazing attendance record often top in Camden!
- We are a **water only school**: both in school and on trips. Every child should have a named water-bottle to be taken home each day to be refreshed. A firm no to sugary flavoured waters.
- Scooters and bikes must be parked tidily behind Years 5 and 6. This area is a fire evacuation route so it is essential that it is kept clear and tidy in the event of a real fire this could cause an accident and a delay. If any bikes and scooters are left overnight (and often for days) we cannot take responsibility for their disappearance.
- No toys allowed during the school day please.
- We don't allow any **jewellery**, other than simple stud earrings. Please ensure that **long hair is tied up** it helps focus in class and helps prevent the spread of nits.
- Please book into Breakfast Club and Club EP using the EP "Piota" App. If your child attends
  regularly, please still make a new booking at the start of each half term, as the booking calendar
  resets. Please book through the EP App wherever possible.

## Some safeguarding reminders:

- Dropping off and collecting children within the school day please come directly to the school office and do not go to your child's classroom. It is essential that we know who is on site for safeguarding reasons, including adults, and we need you to sign in and sign out during the school day.
- If you need to come in to drop off key messages, items or forgotten lunches, please do this at the office.
- If your child is in school and expected at Club EP or an afterschool sports club, please let us
  know if they are <u>not</u> attending. We of course understand that plans change, but you must notify
  us as their absence will be of concern until we can locate them.
- Please inform the school office by 9am if your child will not be attending school. A phone call is best where possible.
